ML-09-0106

The above-named Petitioner filed a hearing request with the Division of Hearings and Appeals on April 15, 2009 to contest the disqualification of Petitioner's WIC retail vendor participation. A hearing in the above-captioned matter was scheduled for December 1, 2009.

Prior to the hearing, the Office of Legal Counsel for the Department of Health Services (DHS) and Petitioner's attorney reported, however, that this matter has been resolved and no hearing was held. Subsequently a written settlement agreement was submitted to the Division of Hearings and Appeals. It was signed by legal representatives for both parties in February 2010 and is incorporated herein by reference. Among other things, in it, Petitioner agrees to withdraw this hearing request and the DHS moves to dismiss this appeal. The Division of Hearings and Appeals will, therefore, dismiss the appeal.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is ORDERED

That the petition for review is hereby dismissed.

REQUEST FOR A REHEARING

This is a final administrative decision. You may petition for an administrative rehearing by submitting a specific written request to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, P.O. Box 7875, Madison, WI 53707-7875. This request must be received by the Division within 20 days of the date of this Order. The process for requesting a rehearing petition is contained in Wisconsin Statutes § 227.49.

APPEAL TO CIRCUIT COURT

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed no more than 30 days after the date of this hearing decision (or 30 days after a denial of a rehearing, if you ask for one). For purposes of appeal to circuit court, the Respondent is this matter is the Department of Health Services. Appeals must be served on the Office of the Secretary of that Department, either personally or by certified mail. The address of the

Department is: 1 West Wilson Street, Room 650, Madison, Wisconsin, 53703. The process for appeals to the circuit court is in Wisconsin Statutes §§ 227.52 and 227.53.
